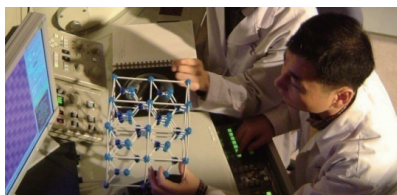

Uam Historical Park, which is located at the foot of Gyejoksan Mountain in Gayang-dong, used to be a place where a famous Confucian scholar of the Joseon Dynasty, Song Si-yeol (1607-1689), studied. There are several important cultural assets and properties, such as Nangangjeonsa House, and Gigukjeong Pavilion and Songja Daejeonpan (the wooden printing blocks for the books by Song Si-yeol), in the park.

Songaedang House is Detached Quarters of the House of Kim Kyung-yeo, who served as a royal inspector for urging soldiers to fight during Byeongjahoran (Chinese invasion of Korea in 1636). 'Songae,' his pen name, means cherishing strong fidelity of pine trees and strong spirit of the tall cliffs.

Dongchundang House (National Treasure No. 209) was reconstructed in 1643 by Song Jun-gil (1606-1672) (pen name: Dongchundang), who served as Defense Minister during the reign of King Hyojong of the Joseon Dynasty. It used to be a place for ancient scholars to study and meet with fellow scholars to discuss Confucianism.

Upon entering the main gate, there is a big sarangchae (guest house) on the left, in which the head of family used to study or greet guests, and a small sarangchae on the right, which was used as a living quarter for parents or grown-up sons or daughters. Upon entering the middle gate, there is a ㄱ-shaped inner house and in the backyard, there is a shrine that has "Shrine of the Song Clan" written on it.

Ssangcheongdang Detached Quarters of the House

Ssangcheong literally means "the purest breath of air and brightest light of the moon in the universe." The building was named after the house owner's pen name. During the Joseon Dynasty, dancheong (traditional multicolored paintings on wooden buildings) was not allowed to be used for private homes. It is peculiar to see that this house has dancheong on it.

Yuhoe means to "behold one's late parents in esteem and reverence." Gwon Ijin (1668-1734) (pen name: Yuhodang), a scholar during the late Joseon Dynasty, built this wooden house to pay homage to his late parents. It is located in Musu-dong, which is southwest of Bomunsan Mountain.

Gosansa Temple was built by Great Monk Doseongooksa in 886, the first year of King Jeonggang of Shilla Dynasty, and was remodeled by Great Monk Sudenggooksa in 1636, the 14th year of King Injo's reign of Joseon Dynasty. Yangsunggak and Geungnakbojeon Hall are located inside the temple, and two stupas are seated in left front of Daeungjeon Hall.

This confucian academy was built in 1693 in memory of Kwon Deukki (pen name: Manhoe) and Kwon si (pen name: Tanong), who were scholars during the mid Joseon Period. The king named the hall in 1711. Later the Andong Kwon clan restored it twice in 1968 and 1973, respectively.

Munchungsa Shrine

This shrine was built to enshrine the mortuary tablets and portraits of the Confucian scholars Song Byung-sun (1836-1905) and Song Byung-soon (1839-1912), who resisted the Japanese occupation of Korea and were patriotic martyrs. Originally, it was set up in Yeongdong, Chungbuk, but later it was relocated in 1966 to its present place, where they were born and martyred, as part of a project for commemorating the 60th anniversary of their martyrdom.

Bongsoru Pavilion

This was the study room of Nam Bun-bung (1607-1674) where he taught his students. He was the head of the Servant Management Department under the reign of King Injo. He succeeded the scholastic mantle of Cho Kwang-jo. Bongsoru Pavilion was originally called "Bongsojae," which means a bird's nest, implying it was an educational institution.

Suwoongyo Dosolcheon Cheondan

Suwoongyo Dosolcheon Cheondan is a building that was intended to serve as the location for the unification of Confucianism, Buddhism, and Zen Buddhism under the religious sect leader, Choi Jewoo, who founded Donghak, a national religion.

- Cheondan: A symbolic building within the Suwoongyo Dosolcheon Naewonkyeong that was built in 1923 to worship the heavens.
- Seokgo, also known as Seokjong: A natural stone that resembles a cow that is lying down. When struck with a small stone, it makes a mysterious metallic sound.

It is also a place where people learned how to pay homage to these wise men, and pursued their teachings.

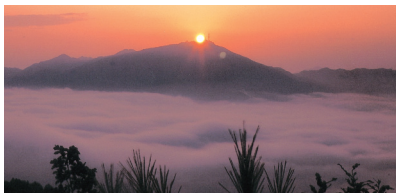
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Sikjongsan Mountain

Sikjongsan Mountain, which is located in the southeastern part of Daejeon, is 623.6 meters high. This mountain is known for its well-preserved forest. There are famous old temples on the mountain, including Gosansa and Gaesimsa. Secheon Park, along with a lake that is located at the base of the mountain, is particularly beautiful in the spring and has well-paved hiking paths. The old name of Sikjongsan was Beopjongsan.

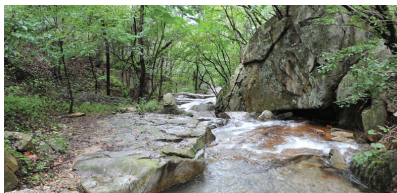

Daejeon's vast field was called Hanbat (one field) from the ancient times. The long stretch of mountains is interrupted by the streams of Gapcheon, Yudeungcheon, and Daejeoncheon that converge into the Geumgang River. The first hiking trail of Sirubong Peak offers a full view the mountains of Gyeryeongsan, Daedunsan, Seodaesan, and Songnisan. The second hiking trail is an easy path which is ideal for families and lovers, and it allows visitors to explore the origins of the Daejeoncheon Stream. The third hiking trail offers a historical experience as it follows the mountain fortresses of the Three Kingdoms Period of ancient Korea and the paths once taken long ago by people carrying knapsacks. This spot also provided inspiration for Daejeon's renowned poem, the Meodeulryeong. The fourth hiking trail is located on Sikjangan Mountain, and it presents the best night view along the Gyeongbu Expressway between Seoul and Busan. The fifth and sixth hiking trails offer the magnificent view of the Daecheong Dam, making them ideal places to relax mind and body of travelers. In summary, these 12 courses offer the best well-being mountain trail experiences for visitors.
